Description

The Children Rising Mentorship Program is a cross-cultural learning exchange and mentorship partnership with Skownan First Nation. Participants in this year-long program take part in educational activities, such as cultural teachings and lectures, to deepen their understanding of the history and cultures of First Nations in Canada. They also mentor and support young learners from Skownan First Nation as they participate in the CareerTrek program. This involves bi-weekly communication with mentees, and four weekends visits with their mentee, which alternatively take place in Winnipeg and Skownan First Nation

CanU REACH Health Sciences Instructor

Description

CanU REACH is an on-campus registered charity after school program at the University of Manitoba Bannatyne Campus. Running 13 weeks of the year, CanU REACH brings 40 students in grade 7 from schools across Winnipeg to the Bannatyne campus. On campus, they learn about health care fields such as pharmacy, dentistry, dental hygiene, respiratory therapy, occupational therapy and medicine from current college students. Each week instructors plan hands on experiences for the youth related to the instructors chosen field. Instructors strive to foster a desire to pursue post-secondary education in the health care field while inspiring confidence and hope. Before sessions, instructors are able to participate in the homework club or gym time with the youth and after everyone enjoys a meal together.

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
